The European Commission has launched this initiative to foster cooperation between higher education institutions. It aims to boost exchanges of students, researchers and academic staff and to support mobility, in particular from non-EU countries to EU Member States.

Who can benefit and how?

Undergraduate, master, doctorate and postdoctoral students.

Academic staff (for teaching, training and research)

The duration of the exchange can vary from 1 to 34 months and selected candidates can receive assistance with travel and insurance costs and tuition fees.

They will also receive a monthly allowance ranging from 1000 to 2500 euros.

Scholarships are not limited to students and academic staff of the universities of the selected partnership. Nationals of eligible non-EU countries can also benefit under certain conditions. Particular attention will be paid to non-EU country students in vulnerable situations.
